Coniston & Torver Community Land Trust

Cllr Troughton reported that the utilities are currently being put in for the local occupancy houses in the Oak Howe field. These houses will not be built until the affordable ones are started in Church Room Field, hopefully in September.

An annual housing need survey can now be carried out based on people listed on Cumbria Choice Based letting.

The CLT are doing an up-to-date list of houses not permanently occupied in Coniston, at the last count it was 52%

The LDNPA Local Plan including two sites for future housing and employment – Low Gateside Field and near Thwaites.

<u>John Moffat – General Manager, South Lakes, National Trust</u>

John Moffat sent a report by e-mail:- works have started to deal with the Phytopthora outbreak around Tarn Hows and there are a lot of trees to come down. There will be an impact on access and footpaths while the work is being completed and as far as possible it will be completed by end of September before the trees start to spore again.

Cllrs Carroll and Swyer reported it was a positive meeting. To date there is a combination of different agreements with Parish Councils and lengthsmen around the county. There were different organisations came together to discuss progressing this. A framework will be coming out with a full-time project officer with legal help and a budget.

To update on grants applied for towards new flower planters

The Clerk has applied for funding towards new planters for the village and is awaiting a decision.

To update on other Highways issues in the Parish

A tidy up is required at Haws Bank.

There has been a tree across the footpath on the way to the lake below the road bridge.

There is water on the footpath between Park Coppice to Park Gate with people walking on the higher ground to avoid it. There is also a lot of water coming down from the footpath above Outrake.

The water leak on Lake Road has been finally repaired and all the grids cleaned.

259/2018 **Councillor Matters**

Barclays Bank in Coniston will be closing on Friday 7th December. Barclays are willing to help with the transition and the Post Office will be able to offer some services. It was considered making the building a Community Asset.

There is a problem with overgrown vegetation on Devonshire Terrace. The cliff face will be cleared by LDNPA before the end of the year.

There have been several occasions where rubbish has been found in Guards Wood and the National Trust need to be made aware.

The majority of comments about the recent Lakeland 100 event were positive.

SLDC have offered another tree for the Campbell Memorial and if the Parish Council would like the last transferred to them. It was noted the Parish Council would then have to pay for the grass cutting. It was suggested that the existing tree stump be removed.

Cllr Coward is working on having a Christmas Tree at the Campbell Memorial and

	battery powered lights would be required.
	There are signs in the village indicating the ferry on Windermere and these need to masked off by Cumbria County Council whilst the ferry is out of action.

A parking space has been made at Gould Cottage and there are safety concerns from a highways perspective. In the same area the parking of vehicles immediately outside the chip shop is causing highways issues.

Cllr Carroll will be having a meeting to progress the Coniston Round leaflet.

Yew Tree Tarn is now full of water again but the fishing club cannot afford to restock it.

Other villages have poppy plaques relating to those who lost their lives in World War 1 and it was suggesting having these on the railings at the TIC garden. Further investigation is required.

Cllr Carroll has suggested that Coniston could become a pilot through Cumbria Community Foundation for a Second Home Fund Scheme. This would involve people who have second homes or holiday lets donating a weeks income towards local schemes for the benefit of the community. The key would be keeping the money local.

Cllr Coward has ordered "No Dogs" signs for the playground.

Silhouettes for church – funding for 10. Beacon is at 7pm on 11th November.

Due to the number of users at the Bridge Toilets the facilities are not always in the condition the Parish Council would like to see.
