# **County Councillor**

#### **District Councillors**

Councillor Wharton submitted a report which indicated that:

- There are plans in place to manage the increased numbers of visitors to the area. These plans are supported by weekend patrols to educate and enforce good behaviour on those misbehaving e.g. poor parking, fires, barbecues, litter, wild/fly camping, off-roaders.
- Volunteers have been most successful welcoming visitors at particular 'hot spots' such as Monk Coniston and Brown Howe.
- The District Council is issuing Start Up Grants and Welcome Back Grants to help businesses to recover from the previous year.
- Councillor Wharton took the opportunity to congratulate Councillor Troughton on her election to the District Council.

### Councillor Coward reported that:

• The District Council had performed well to by making grants available and accessible to the people and businesses of South Lakeland.

#### **National Trust**

Mr Moffat submitted a report that:

- Indoor attractions including Beatrix Potter Gallery, and Hill Top are all open from today.
- Holiday cottages, camp and caravan sites are reopening from today
- Numbers of visitors had been increasing but outdoor sights remained relatively quiet.
- Steam Yacht Gondola is busy and continues to operate, but at a reduced capacity
- There are no empty properties in the Parish, however, the process to find new tenants for Boon Crag has begun.

#### Coniston Business Forum
