301/2021	Apologies There were no apologies. Councillor Thompson's resignation had been received. The Chair and the Parish Council joined in thanking Councillor Thompson for his years of service.	
302/2021	Requests for Dispensations None.	
303/2021	Declarations of disclosable pecuniary interests in respect of Agenda items The Parish Council is Custodian Trustee of the Coniston Institute and Ruskin Museum. Councillor Troughton had previously been employed by Mr Johnston, planning applicant (6.1 7/2021/5696 and 7/2021/5711); similarly Councillor Coward's holiday cottage is let-out through the planning applicant's letting agency. Both Councillors Troughton and Coward determined to take no part in discussion or decision making in relation to these planning issues.	
304/2021	Minutes RESOLVED: that the Minutes of the Meeting held on 23 rd August 2021 were approved as a true and accurate record subject to the inclusion of a minor amendment. These are to be signed at a later date.	
305/2021	Public Participation <u>County Councillor</u> Councillor Brereton reported on a range of issues with particular emphasis on highways, parking and enforcement matters including: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Emergency parking measure can be flagged up to the County Council and, where circumstances dictate, they will respond quickly.	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He had allocated a part of his Highway Members Fund to support the new signing required at The Ship. • B4RN is being debated in the House of Commons. Meetings are being held throughout the Upper Furness to move the project forward. • Local Government Reorganisation, working groups will be set up soon to work out details across a range of issues including budgets. <p><u>District Councillors</u></p> <p>Councillor Coward:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Business Grants still available, however, it is hoped that all those eligible have accessed them by now. • Locality Grants will be available soon. • Parliamentary constituency reform is still ongoing. • Due to ongoing staff shortages, Green bin collection may be disrupted to ensure that Grey bin collection is prioritised. <p><u>National Trust</u></p> <p>Mr Moffat submitted a report that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visitor management has been challenging. The area remains busy and will so well in to October. • Steam yacht Gondola remains busy, it is not operating on Fridays but as with other attractions such as Beatrix Potter Gallery, Hill Top and Wray Castle, it will operate to the end of October. • No vacant properties in the parish and none coming up. New tenants will take over Boon Crag farm from the end of September. • Tree disease continues to increase for larch and ash, there will be significant work extending well into the autumn. • The National Trust is in contact with B4RN's local team to identify access issues. <p><u>Coniston Business Forum</u></p> <p>Mr Rutland indicated that the business community is very busy; as a result, there had not been a Forum meeting for a while. The Forum has kept members informed of issues surrounding car parking in the village including the planning issues at Land's Field. The Forum itself is not taking a position, but has advised those members who feel strongly to make their views known via the correct channels.</p> <p><u>Coniston and Torver Community Land Trust</u></p> <p>Mr Cameron briefed the parish council on delay to occupancy of the houses on Church Room Field, Yewdale Road. He also updated progress on the development of the heritage work being undertaken at the slate quarry, Saddlestone Bank.</p> <p><u>Councillors attending the Institute Committee meeting</u></p> <p>Councillor Sargeant reported that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Vintage Fair will end on the 3rd October 2021 this will allow the 	
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	<p>main hall to be used for music events.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The is a 'Day with Gina' event scheduled for the 25th September • The Ruskin Museum will be closing for Christmas on the 17th December. • Visitor numbers have been at almost pre-pandemic levels. • The new constitution is being developed. • The Annual General Meeting will be held on 12th October 2021. • The issue of Bluebird continues: various options were itemised, it is hoped that all parties can agree a positive way forward. <p>306/2021</p> <p><u>Public Participation</u></p> <p>There were a number of representations from members of the public in relation to the planning application 7/2021/5696 being considered at this meeting.</p> <p>Points against the application were presented in written form and read out by the clerk. Points included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The scale of the development makes the car park and the surrounding roads unsafe for both vehicles and pedestrians • There are no on-site facilities • There are no electric charging points or disabled car parking spaces • The development constitutes an a major development in contravention of the Coniston Neighbourhood Plan 2015, • It has an excessive impact on the landscape in an historic village in a World Heritage landscape. • Contrary to Policy 22: Sustainable travel, it encourage the use of private motor vehicles. <p>Points raised in favour of the application were made by several individuals including the applicant:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A local business indicated that the car park has had a positive impact on business, on staff as well as addressing the parking and traffic issues in the village. • Mr Johnston explained the need for a car park and addressed some of the issues raised in the letters which had been read out: • The number of visitors to the Lake District had grown exponentially during the last decade; this has led to increased traffic and parking difficulties. • The Tactical Management Group encouraged landowners to establish pop-up car parks to create additional spaces to absorb increased need. • Existing car parks such as Ruskin Avenue were full for much of the day. • Electric car charging was too expensive to undertake at present. • Disabled car parking spaces had not been included as this was a temporary car park. • Engineers had approved drainage and other ground works. • The car park will encourage longer stays, fewer journeys, joined up transport links. • The three reports submitted immediately before the meeting all showed support for additional car parking in the village.

309/2021	<p>Broadband for the Rural North (B4RN)</p> <p>A meeting held on 1st September had generated a good level of interest. It is hoped to achieve closer working ties with neighbouring parish councils to help achieve the introduction of B4RN to benefit residents in the parish to be able to access effective broadband.</p>	

310/2021	<p>Coniston Maintenance, Parking and Highways</p> <p><u>Lake Road Playground</u></p> <p>Playdale Ltd inspected the playground, as the equipment is 13 to 14 years old there is a need to identify the expected life expectancy, design of replacement equipment and cost.</p> <p>Councillor Brereton indicated that a grant application should be submitted to the Children and Young People's Working Group.</p> <p><u>Highways and Maintenance Issues</u></p> <p>Councillor Troughton highlighted the road safety issues experienced by the residents of Far End, Holly How Youth Hostel and Holly How Close whilst attempting to walk into the village. Highways are to be alerted to these concerns in the expectation that they might identify a safe walking route into the village.</p>	
311/2021	<p>Public Toilet Renovations</p> <p>A further meeting of the working group will be held to identify the most appropriate way forward. Councillor Atkinson will take the place left vacant following Councillor Thompson's resignation.</p>	
312/2021	<p>Coniston Parish Council Website</p> <p>Councillor Buller reported that the design of the home page is encouraging and future development is progressing well.</p>	
313/2021	<p>Safer Lakes</p> <p>It was noted that this had been a busy summer, but joint working between key agencies appears to have been effective in curtailing the worst excesses of last year. Temporary parking provision had increased capacity, innovation such as the use of shuttle buses to ferry people between car parks and areas they want to visit have been useful in reducing, and managing, vehicular traffic.</p> <p>It was noted that visitors who did not avail themselves of the toileting facilities in the village were misusing the Old Furness Road area. Councillor Brereton indicated that he held a contingency fund to help areas deal with additional visitors and requested to be contacted in order to arrange funding.</p>	
314/2021	<p>Climate Focus</p> <p>St Andrew's Church have given the Parish Council the authority to manage the wide verge along Old Hawkshead Road to the left of the lych gate into the graveyard with the intention that this can be used as a bed for native bulbs and wildflowers. Funding for the project has been secured from Mr Phil Blaylock, Lakeland Trails. Mrs Lian Dixon has agreed to lead on the project and Councillor Coward will work with Coniston Get Buzzing Group to</p>	

	<p>seek active involvement in the design and implementation of the scheme.</p> <p>Mr Carroll raised the issue of the National Park land comprising the slope below Old Furness Road and above Station Road. This area has been neglected and would make a suitable site for the creation of a nature reserve in the heart of the village.</p>									
315/2021	<p>South Lakeland Code of Conduct for Councillors</p> <p>RESOLVED: to adopt the nationally agreed Code of Conduct and to attend training organised by South Lakeland District Council.</p>									
316/2021	<p>First Aid and Water Safety</p> <p>The greatly appreciated work of the First Responders was discussed. The need to attract further recruits will be supported by the Parish Council.</p> <p>RESOLVED: Councillor Sargeant will work with Judith Myers, First Responders, to compile a list of defibrillators in the parish.</p>

South Lakeland District Council needs to be encouraged to be more pro-active in relation to enforcement.</p> <p><u>Councillor Coward</u> Mr Willy Watson has recently passed the 35 years in the fire service, the parish council asked the clerk to write to thank him for his years of service.</p> <p><u>Councillor Atkinson</u> The Water Safety Campaign will be extended to cover Coniston Water.</p>
